Our 2010 Cabernet Sauvignon took Double Gold in the \$40 to \$49.99 category, one of the competition's highest honors. We always knew our 2010 Cabernet (grown on our own Pesonen Estate – Alexander Valley) was a premium vintage, and we're humbled to receive this lofty distinction.

There were more than 6,300 entries in this year's San Francisco Chronicle Wine Competition, making it the largest competition of American wines in the world. Now that we're deep into winter 2015, and much of the country is experiencing a deep and frosty chill, this is an excellent time to stock up on your favorite William Gordon wines to hold and warm you through the season.

2010 Estate Cabernet Sauvignon – Pesonen Vineyard, Alexander Valley

With a pronounced aroma of toast, vanilla and blackberry, this ruby beauty is delightful and tasty! Its spicy, black fruit and cassis flavors balance wonderfully with oak and acid. Tannins are fine, with an elegant, soft black fruit finish. Aged in the finest French oak – 550 cases produced.

(100% Cabernet Sauvignon, pH 3.55, TA 6.5, Alcohol 14.1, 550 cases produced. Oak Barrels – 100% French, Colbert Forest, Noisette Toast)
